

**REPUBLIC SQUARE**  
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 Visit Republic Square in the evening and enjoy the famous singing fountains.

**THE HISTORY MUSEUM & THE NATIONAL GALLERY OF ARMENIA**  
 The History Museum was founded in 1921 as the Art department – one of the oldest departments. The Museum of History and the National Gallery are in the same building, turning it into a museum complex. The richest collection of exhibits (400,000 items) is kept in the Armenian National Museum. Among the museum exhibits, national costumes, ancient and modern photographs.  
 The National Gallery of Armenia is one of the best in the former USSR territory due to its rich collection. There are more than 2000 exhibits, including works of Armenian, Russian, Western European masters, sketches, sculptures and handicrafts from Western Europe.

**CHARLES AZNAVOUR SQUARE**  
 This square is semi-circular, located between Tumanyan and Pushkin Streets. The square complex was designed and built in 1927-1956, when the well-known "Yerevan" hotel (now "Grand Hotel Yerevan"), Stanislavsky Russian Drama Theatre, "Moscow" cinema and the Union of Artists of Armenia were built.  
 In the center of the square, there is a "Constellation" fountain with the 12 signs of the zodiac. Here are also statues of scrap metal and automobile parts, which give the square a unique atmosphere. One of the favorite works is sculptor Ar Arakelyan's bull, strange spider and horse.  
 There is a big chess platform in Aznavour Square. It was deployed in 2013, in honor of becoming Armenia for the third time as the World Chess Champion. This is one of the most favorite places in the park where you can enjoy photography, and kids learn to play chess.

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 In the life of the Armenian people, the National Academic Theatre of Opera and Ballet has its unique place.

**CASCADE**  
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 In the center of the cultural center is on the left. There are 15 small fountains in the Cascade, designed and constructed in the form of medieval solar watches, all unique, different, and are carved on every open terrace of the Cascade. In any part of the Cascade, you will not see any single bar-relief, the only thing that unites them – national symbols, connotations, gears, sprockets, ornaments and more. You can reach the highest point of Cascade, climbing 57 stairs or by a free escalator.

**MATENADARAN**  
 Mesrop Mashtots Institute of Ancient Manuscripts known as Matenadaran  
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 There are more than 1,700 manuscripts in the Matenadaran. In front of the museum, there is an statue of Mesrop Mashtots, the creator of the Armenian alphabet, and his pupil, Koryun.

**THE VENISSEGE**  
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 The Venisseg is open on Saturdays and Sundays, some pavilions, and on weekdays. Prices in Venisseg are affordable.

**ST. GREGORY THE ILLUMINATOR CHURCH**  
 The church was opened in 2009 by Garegin II, dedicated to the 1700th anniversary of the proclamation of Christianity as a state religion in Armenia.  
 In November of the same year, the spiritual delegation from Vatican brought the relics of St. Gregory the Illuminator which were gift from Pope John Paul II. The church has 1700 seats, it has 3 entrance to the north, south and west.

**12 THINGS MUST TO DO**

- Visit "Erebuni" Historical-Cultural Reserve-Museum, get acquainted with the foundation of the city, chronology. There is a Yerevan birth certificate, a coronet portrait dating back to the Urartian era, which proves the foundation of the city.
- Visit the Yerevan History Museum, located in the building of Yerevan Municipality on Argishtis street and you will find the history of Yerevan from the day it was founded to our days.
- Visit the Republic Square, especially after 20:00 AM to admire the "singing" fountains.
- Take two-hour "Yerevan City Tour" by double-deck bus from Republic Square.
- If you want to buy a Yerevan souvenir, visit the open-air outdoor fair Venisseg.
- The doors of the "Malikhas" Jazz Club (Pushkin Street), "Yans" and "Mezzo" clubs are always open for jazz lovers.
- If you want to experience the aroma of Yerevan Brandy, visit Yerevan Brandy factory near Victory Bridge.
- In the evening, visit the famous Sayan street to get acquainted with the unique bohemian life of Yerevan. Here you can find the best Armenian wines as well as the "old and new" world but just spend a wonderful evening.
- Visit the Matenadaran to enquire about the ancient manuscripts, see the 500-year-old typed book, etc.
- Visit North Avenue to see modern Yerevan, visit beautiful galleries, shop, drink a cup of coffee, have a restaurant and, of course, to taste the Armenian bratshka.
- Visit the Cascade to get acquainted with modern Yerevan, go up 572 stairs to get on the observation deck of Cascade, where you can enjoy a wonderful view of Ararat Mountain.
- Welcome to the agricultural market (Aznavour adjacent to Khrometis Street) to buy Armenian fresh and natural products, fruits, vegetables, dried fruits, lavash (Armenian bread), etc.

**YEREVAN**

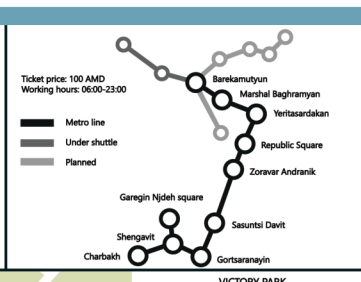
**Information about Yerevan**  
 Yerevan is a community governed by the RA Law on Local Self-Government. The highest governing bodies are Yerevan Mayor and the Council of Elders.  
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**THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE MUSEUM-INSTITUTE**  
 The Armenian Genocide Museum opened its doors in 1995, ahead of the 80th anniversary of the Armenian Genocide. The Genocide Memorial was built to commemorate the innocent victims of the first genocide of the 20th century. Yerevan museum exhibits are presented in Armenian, English, French and German.

**KAREN DEMIRCHYAN SPORT AND CONCERTS COMPLEX**  
 The Karen Demirchyan Sports and Concerts Complex is a large sports and cultural complex. It was built in 1960s and is one of the most famous landmarks in Yerevan. It includes a stadium, a sports arena, and a concert hall.

Yerevan development in recent years is exceptional: the capital of Armenia has simultaneously occupied several authoritative rating tables, surpassing several regional and European developed cities as well as attracting international investors and tourists attention. Among them are the Aerial Ratings, Reuters, First Company.  
**Religion:** Armenian Apostolic Church. The Armenian Church is represented in the city by the Ararat Patriarchal Diocese, with the St. Sarkis Cathedral being the seat of the prelaty. There are 21 churches in Yerevan. Beside the Armenian Church, there are also other spiritual centers, such as the Russian Orthodox Church, the Islamic Mosque Mosque.

**THE BAR DISTRICT**  
 Many locals spend their evenings in the Bar District. This area, consisting of a square formed by Perapati, Pushkin, Sayan and Tumanyan streets, is where the famous Yerevan Brandy bars and pubs are located. The bars are all close to each other, so if you happen to dislike one, you can easily move to another. Local and tourists alike enjoy the "hoping" making every evening a joyful, exciting and fun. In Yerevan, the pubs are more popular than nightclubs, so you'll see far more of the former than the latter. The pubs are cozy and always crowded. They used to play mostly rock music, but nowadays you'll hear reggae music, lounge music, classic rock, jazz and alternative. By the way, unlike Europe, smoking is allowed indoors here.  
 Foreigners are greeted very warmly everywhere, and every bar is in English. Local draught beers are especially popular for visitors. The so-called "bar rug" begins at the crossroad of Tumanyan and Ghazar Perapati streets. It is easy to get to the Bar District, but it is incredibly difficult to leave it. Slowly but surely, it sucks you into the Albanian Yerevan night.

**SARYAN STREET**  
 The street named after the well-known Armenian artist Martiros Saryan, situated in the center of Yerevan. The street crosses the Armenian street, a continuation of Moscow street, and ends at Marikots Avenue. House-museum of the great artist of the XX century – Martiros Saryan (1880-1972) was built by special order of the Armenian government and opened in 1967 during Martiros' lifetime. The past several years this district became an attractive district when many wine houses have been opened in the area. There are a number of wine bars in Saryan Street representing unique wines from all over the world. However, it should be mentioned that Armenia is known as ancient cradle of winemaking since old times. If you want to enjoy a nice evening resting Armenian local or other types of wine, then visit Saryan street to enjoy your evening. And it is no coincidence that "WineDays Festival" is organized right here / May 4-5.

**CHILDREN'S RAILWAY**  
 The Children's Railway is one of the most popular places for locals to go with their children and grandchildren. It is situated in the Hazratn Gorge and you can get there either by car, or far more exciting, by the Yerevan Zangak train that goes from the Charents Museum on Mestrov Avenue through a tunnel under the post office building on Sayan Street. The most appealing place in the park is the children's railway with its colorful trains. The first train set off here on 19/3/1973. The Children's Railway is still a favourite place for boys and girls of today's generation. A long white staircase passes down the gorge towards a beautiful station with its red and white facade and a green that looks straight out of a fairy tale. It has no particular schedule. It leaves whenever it is needed. The ride takes about 15 minutes in total, passing some nice scenery. It goes along the Hazratn River, through a forest and then through a 45-meter tunnel, arriving at Hrazdan Station. The train returns to Yeghvard.

**WATER WORLD**  
 The water park is a real oasis located in about 12 hectares of greenery, where the summer heat can be cool and enjoyable. The water world works in warm weather of the year and offers its customers a variety of fun, full-scale water amenities as well as for adults.

**EREBUNI historical-archaeological reserve-museum**  
 "Erebuni" Historical-archaeological reserve-museum was founded on October 21st, 1988 on the occasion of 2500th anniversary of the opening of Erebuni Yerevan fortress-tower. 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**BLUE MOSQUE (GEOK JAMI)**  
 This Persian mosque, built in 1765, on the decree of Hussein Khan is situated in the center of the city on Mashtots Avenue. English explorer H. Lynch who had paid a visit to Yerevan at the end of 19th century of the structure with great wall and minaret. The mosque was built in accordance with the features of the architecture characteristic of Shia Islam. It is rectangular in its plan, has a minaret adjoining the structure and a dome. The mosque is one of the most beautiful in the city. The minarets are lined with blue, red and green bricks. Under the Soviet reign, the structure was preserved by the government. It was restored in 1940-1952. In 1994-1996, the government of Iran had the mosque renovated and converted into the Cultural Complex of Iran by the Embassy of Islamic Republic of Iran.
